

Solar photovoltaic panels daylighting rights

One of the key provisions of the California Solar Rights Act is the protection of solar access rights for property owners. This means that property owners have the right to access sunlight for solar energy generation, subject to reasonable restrictions. Solar providers submitting applications to interconnect residential solar customers in the service areas of Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Edison (SCE), San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E), Bear Valley Electric Service (BVES), PacifiCorp, and Liberty are required to .
