It involves installing 7,000 photovoltaic panels over the graves and other structures at public cemeteries in Valencia, resulting in a total . Solar Panels on the graveyard power up the homes of those alive

They have installed 462 solar panels on top of the grave niches which in turn power up the local energy grid. The energy generated is equivalent to the yearly consumption of 60 homes.
